

Recently report card grades were assigned to schools across Alabama and across the country. It is my belief that we have three very outstanding schools in Tallassee. Our goal is always to find ways to make our schools even better. Many of you reading this article as well as myself wonder what truly makes up a good school. me share some Let thoughts on this subject.

To begin with there are several areas to consider when making a determination as to the quality of a school; safety, academics, fine arts, extra-curricular activities, special education services, the poverty status of children in a school district, attendance, college and career readiness, enrichment opportunities, graduation rate, dropout rate, quality facilities, and school funding. If I were to choose the top three areas, school safety would always be at the top of our list followed closely by quality academic programs and attendance. If our children are not in a safe and nurturing school climate, they will not succeed at their highest level possible. Providing a high quality academic program so that students are

I have stated on numerous occasions that we 'own' our test scores and they tell only part of the story for each our of schools. although schools are more than a test score. A school's climate is critically important towards providing the 'right' environment for which to learn. We are more than a test score, we are a community school. We are a faith



based community that strongly supports athletics and fine arts and takes great pride in the accomplishments of our schools. We care deeply about the children in our schools and strive to make our schools better each year.




