STEM education is an interdisciplinary approach to learning where academic concepts are coupled with real-world lessons as students apply science, technology, engineering, and mathematics in contexts that make connections between school and community. During the 2018-2019 school year, Southside Middle School installed a computer lab where students practiced various aspects of STEM digitally. The 2019-2020 school year we will add the final component to our STEM program with the creative learning lab. The new lab is being installed this summer at SMS. Ancient Advice for a Modern Malady

Whenever he stands to speak or sits to write, Mike McElroy remembers the apostle Paul's words: "Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart." After more than 40 years of studying, preaching and teaching the Bible, Mike knows the privilege, opportunity and any ability he has as a communicator are all gifts of God's grace.

"As pressure and stress bear down on me, I find joy in your commands." - Psalm 119:143 NLT

Do you remember the Calgon commercials from 50 years ago? You may not remember the product, but I suspect you would remember the commercial if you were around back in the day. It went like this: A customer at the laundry asked the Asian man at the counter how they got the clothes so fresh. The fellow behind the counter smiled and said, "Ancient Chinese secret!" Then a woman called out from the back, "We need more Calgon!" Then the customer would say, "Ancient Chinese secret, huh?" The laundry man would smile sheepishly.

That ad might run into some resistance for some sort of political incorrectness these days. But I suppose we could call today's thought an "ancient Jewish secret" about a solution to a modern problem.

From reading online or in the paper, or watching the news or browsing in a bookstore, we might get the idea that stressful living is a modern phenomenon. Articles about the debilitating

effects of stress are everywhere. Books that outline strategies for coping with the pressures of 21st century living are plentiful. Some of us have apps like "Breathe" or "Relax" on our phones.

Our text was written 3,000 years ago, and the ancient Jewish writer knew about stressful living. Maybe his stresses didn't come from the same causes as yours or mine. Maybe he wasn't too worried about high prices, deep debt, the uncertain economy, heavy traffic or a slow internet connection. Perhaps he worried more about finding food and water for his family, or protecting them from a wild beast or a roving bandit. If David wrote **Psalm 119** (and I still think he did), maybe the burdens of ruling Israel and fighting enemies on every side were getting to him. It's more likely the author measured life by the month instead of the minute, but he still knew the burden of stress.

And he knew the way to avoid being overwhelmed by the pressure. He told the Lord, "I find joy in your commands." Our ESV has "but your commands are my delight." Counselors tell anxious clients, "You can't always control the situation, but you can control how you react to the situation." That advice is an echo of what the psalmist was talking about. He was able to maintain a joyful heart in the face of troubles and pressures because his joy was rooted in knowing God and God's will for his life.

In a sea of uncertainty and change, there is security in knowing and doing the will of God. When stress bears down, we can find comfort in the sure guidance of God's will.

How about you? Do you have a time and place in your busy life for the word of God? Do you have enough of his word in your mind to meditate on it and find joy even in adversity? Do you know the calm joy of knowing and doing God's will when others around you are in an uproar and adrift because their actions are not based on moral principles? You and I cannot eliminate all stress from our lives. But I hope the next time you're "stressed out" that you'll remember this source of joy that will keep you from being overwhelmed by the pressure.

Seasonal Reasoning: Where do we go from here?

I'm in this glass box. I want to speak, but I'm mute. I can't see myself. It's like I'm invisible and have only eyes to see out. There's a casket up front, but I'm in the back. It's closed but I know the reality. I know who is inside. I see people standing and speaking. A woman, my friend, is at the podium. She's speaking with tears in her eyes. I see my loved ones lining the front row. My only concern is my name. I don't want them to speak my name. I only want to hear Christ's name. I'm yelling but no sound is coming out, "only talk about HIM!" It's become repetition.

I haven't ever really been able to close my eyes and see myself in the future. I pull out of my driveway and wave bye to my children praying it won't be the last time, every time I leave them. I don't dream of myself as an old lady. I only dream of myself in this box, it's every night different dreams but always there's the box. I am so busy in the present that I think I have clouded God's vision of my future. My mind always goes to my funeral & the words that will be spoken in the service. Where do I go from here?

I began to think about women in the Bible that were faced with the question "where do we go from here?"

- Mary Magdalene was possessed and healed of evil spirits, what if she hadn't gone with Jesus and spread the good news?

- Elizabeth, at her old age given the opportunity to bear child and more importantly to bear the opportunity to mother the man that would pave the way for Christ... what if she hadn't accepted the call to raise a prophet?

- Mighty, Mighty Rahab. She was one of the 5 women in the lineage of Christ. What if she hadn't hid those soldiers on her roof?

– The bleeding woman in Luke 8 who only wanted to touch the hem of Jesus' garment because she knew what one touch of the King would bring. What if she hadn't pushed her way through the crowd?

- The vagrant woman outside of Simon the Pharisee's house who poured her fragrant perfume and worshipful tears on the feet of Jesus and washed his feet with her hair.... what if she hadn't saved her very best to show her unyielding faith in Jesus' hand of forgiveness?

What each of these women have in common is a simple truth. Each woman chose to follow God's commands at their God-appointed time, when it seemed like insurmountable odds were stacked against them. When it seemed like any other time other than present would be a little more feasible.

The Samaritan woman at the well meets her Messiah.

She perhaps wanted to avoid the respectable townspeople who normally filled their jars in the morning or evening, so she came at noon, the hottest time of the day. As we know now, Her God appointed time. When Jesus was traveling through Samaria on his way to Galilee he met her and spoke with her. Breaking 3 major social rules. John 4: Vs.7-10, 13-17, 28-30, 39 : 7 When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" 8 (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.) 9 Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) 10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."...

13 Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." 15 The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water." 16 He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back." 17 "I have no husband," she replied. Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. 18 The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."...28 Then, leaving her water jar the woman went back to the town and said to the people, 29 "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" 30 They came out of the town and made their way toward him... 39 Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did."

<u>1st Rule Jesus broke was speaking to a woman in public</u> (vs. 7-10).

No Middle Eastern man ever spoke to a woman in public because women were considered inferior to men.

2nd rule Jesus broke was a Jew speaking to a Samaritan (vs. 13-18).

No Jewish person would've ever spoken to a Samaritan because the Jewish people believed that the Samaritan's has betrayed their faith because they had intermarried with people from foreign countries. In verses 13- 18 the almighty TEACHER gave her some lasting soulengaging instructions and sparked some true conviction in the heart of the woman.

3rd rule Jesus broke was the social norm for self-respect (Vs. 28-30 & 39).

No self-respecting man would have ever spoken to such an immoral woman. Five husbands now living with another man she wasn't married to. This woman was a well-known social outcast. She lived a deplorable life by standards of the time.

But Jesus was a teacher. She was spoken to in the understanding that Jesus is love and He is forgiveness. The social barriers had no hold on Him. He showed Himself to be the greatly anticipated Messiah. He offered her forgiveness and new life. So where did she go from here? It's important to note that she was convicted enough to become an agent of change. Complacency and conviction cannot live on the same corner! She was given a new purpose for life. She was given a new testimony, which in turn influenced so many others. She was given a new testimony. Today still the woman at the well is remembered for spreading His name throughout the land of Samaria. She drank the living water and she ran throughout the streets proclaiming with unembarrassed excitement the arrival of the King!

So back to my box. I was given the tools all along! I was given the blood of Jesus. I was given the Holy Spirit. I was given the instructions. So where do I go from here? How do I ensure that Hannah is removed and Christ is inserted so much so that when I'm gone the only thing people talk about is Christ?

I become an agent of change. I use the testimony Christ has given me, because my identity lies in HIM. I accept my God ordained time to break out of the box. I unembarrassed and excitedly run through the streets and share the good news just as she did.
